



Program Highlights

-Early in the year, Goodwill of the Southern Alleghenies was presented with the 2020 Innovation Award by the Cambria Regional Chamber of Commerce for its work integrating one-stop employment help (CareerLink®) centers into public libraries. This integration is now considered a best practice at the state and national levels.

-Goodwill demonstrated great agility with the COVID-19 pandemic. While physical sites were forced to shut down for two months, almost all services continued virtually. When allowed, Goodwill was one of the first providers to safely reopen to continue to serve the community.

-In the summer, Goodwill was approached by the United Way regarding the closure of the Park Avenue Food Pantry, an important food security resources serving the community. Goodwill stepped up to sponsor and house the newly formed Moxham Food Pantry.

-Along with 383 other nonprofits, our Goodwill was selected from a pool of over 6,000 potential nonprofits to receive an “unsolicited and unexpected” major gift from author and philanthropist, MacKenzie Scott. This extremely generous donation will serve the region for years to come by supporting our continued innovation
